- Basket-of-Gold, Amur Maple, Black-eyed Susan, Blue Mist Spirea, Candytuft, Coreopsis, Creeping Periwinkle, Daylily, Evening Primrose, Purple Coneflower, First Love Dianthus, Pine-Leaf Penstemon, Purple Mountain Sun Daisy, Snow-in-Summer, Winecups and Whirling Butterflies.

Spreading a layer of organic mulch around plants can retain moisture during hot temperatures.

Call before you DIG

If you plan to dig anywhere, from home projects to larger jobs, contact 811 before you dig. Digging without contacting 811 increases the chance of damaging utility lines and risks knocking out utility services for you and your neighborhood. It could result in expensive repair costs and even injury or death. Call 811 at least three days before digging to have the utility lines marked for free. It's safe, it's free and it's the law.

Scoop YOUR Poop

Dog poop smells bad and no one likes stepping in it, but it is more than an inconvenience: it is a legitimate danger. Dog poop dangers come in several forms.

- It poisons grass and lawns.
- It carries hookworms, ringworms, tapeworms, and more.
- It transmits human diseases, too!
- It pollutes waterways and is in the same EPA category as oil and mine runoff!
