G. Presentation of the 2026 Budget for the Governmental and Enterprise Funds

Dr. Testa made a presentation of the proposed 2026 budget and highlighted significant changes being proposed for the rate structure of the fire department fund and the water and sewer utilities.

H. Public Hearing for the 2026 Proposed Budget

Director Dixon made a motion to open the 2026 budget hearing at 5:40 PM. Upon a voice vote the motion passed unanimously.

During the public hearing, residents were provided with a map to show the boundary lines for Colorado Centre Metropolitan District along with the history of the Bankruptcy filing with where the District sits today financially. Residents were able to ask why the first responder fee and water usage would increase so much for the new budget. Dr. Testa was able to explain the budget along with why there is a reserve kept for Capital improvements and in case of emergency repairs needed within the District. The public wanted to verify if the District would be annexed into the City of Colorado Springs and Dr. Testa explained the way an annexation would happen. Once Dr. Testa was able to break down the fees and budget information, residents were left with a better understanding of why the fees are charged. Dr. Testa will take into consideration the Public's comment regarding concern over a higher bill and potentially reduce the first responder fee from the initial amount. The public also wanted to know what the cost of park maintenance covers, and it was explained what the employees that work for the water department do to maintain the parks and open space within the boundaries of the District in the unannexed areas.

Director Dixon made a motion to close the 2026 budget hearing at 7:30 PM. Upon a voice vote the motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Testa discussed the progress made with Colorado Springs Utilities in seeking an emergency water supply connection for the District and its potential costs.

Director Shawn Eccles made a motion to have Dr. Testa continue to pursue the emergency connection with Colorado Springs Utilities and was seconded by Director Johnson. Upon a voice vote the motion passed unanimously.

• Government shutdown (Al)

Dr. Testa brought up the government shutdown issues that may arise with customers during this difficult time. The Board discussed the issue and gave directions as follows:

Director Tuthill made a motion to waive late fees and disconnects until the next Board Meeting and was seconded by Director Johnson. Upon a voice vote the motion passed unanimously.
