Mosquitoes need standing water to lay their eggs in. It doesn't take much- even a cupped leaf can hold enough water. OVERGROWN VEGETATION is one of the sneakiest mosquito breeding grounds. Other common areas around the home that gather water:

JULY 2022

GUTTERS, BIRDBATHS, PLANTER DRIP TRAYS, TIRES, TOYS, BUCKETS, and GARDEN EQUIPMENT. CCMD does place mosquito dunks in any visible standing water areas around the common areas of the district but asks the residents to do their part in eliminating standing water around their homes.

FIRE PREVENTION: SAFETY- INSIDE AND OUTSIDE THE HOME

CCMD had three house fires in the past year.

Common causes and risk factors involving house fires (often preventable):

INSIDE OUTSIDE COOKING- a recipe for disaster

unattended food on the stove leaky propane grills overheated cooking oils/grease grill too close to structures improperly maintained appliances improper disposal of charcoal ash

OPEN FLAMES/SPARK-don't get burned by the burn

candles gas or wood fire pits
sooty fireplaces/chimney welding in windy/dry conditions
unattended matches/lighters FIREWORKS- illegal

HEATING APPLIANCES- when firey hot is too warm

operating space heaters near fabrics kerosene deck heaters

HOLIDAY DÉCOR- don't let your party go up in smoke

under-watered Christmas trees weathered patio lighting candles (worth mentioning twice) tiki torches

ELECTRICAL SYSTEMS-(don't) ignite the nite

DIY home wiring projects tree branches near power supply line circuit overload lightning

SMOKING-not just a cancer risk

smoking in bed/on the couch extinguishing in potting soil

CHEMICAL STORAGE- in a shed is most ideal

oily rags- do not pile up, let air dry completely then wash gasoline- proper container with room for vapor expansion chemical compatibility – opposites do not attract!
